Sixth Grade Leadership Team

Our sixth graders have been busy this second half of the school year. They spent some time after school bagging up the wonderful items you all brought in (socks, puzzle books, colored pencils, and mints) which has been given to the Sisters of Charity. We ended up with 72 bags. The leadership team has also organized a 'planting event' in the greenhouse with the preschoolers and the kindergarten students. Each sixth grader was assigned to four or five kids. They assisted them in planting flowers in a cup, which they will keep in the greenhouse until they are ready to brighten up your homes. During this process, the sixth graders will teach the kids a few things about growing plants. We hope they share what they learn with you. Finally, the sixth graders will be helping the preschool kids to plant an acorn in a pot which will be nurtured over the next eight years of their time at Conn-Area Catholic School. When those preschoolers graduate from the sixth grade, they will transplant their tree on the property. This will be the first year of this new tradition.
