A Day in the Life of a Kindergartener



Our day begins with big smiles and warm welcomes as the little ones step into their classroom. The morning routine starts with prayers and messages from our principal, then into the room with a cheerful greeting circle where students share how they feel using words or gestures, setting a positive tone for the day. After that the calendar is updated.

Play-based learning is a cornerstone of kindergarten life. From building with blocks to engaging in imaginative roleplay, children develop creativity, social skills, and problemsolving abilities. Today, for example, the kids watched a candy cane disappear. No, they did not eat it. They made predictions and tracked its disappearance.

Each morning includes a mixture of structured and exploratory learning. Whether it's counting colorful beads during math, practicing letters with the Superkids, or engaging in a science activity like observing the candy care, every child gets hands-on experience.

Mid-morning, the kids gather for a healthy snack and a story. Today, we read about Junie B. Jones and her Secret Santa fiasco. The kids loved predicting what would happen next!

After lunch it's time to head outside! Whether it's running on the playground, drawing on the sidewalk, or playing a group game, outdoor time allows kids to burn energy, build friendships, and enjoy fresh air.

Post-lunch activities often include art. Today, students created Rudolph. Mrs. Hoffer has a special plan in mind for these reindeer.

As the day comes to an end, children participate in a reflection circle, sharing one thing they loved about their day. It's heartwarming to hear their favorite moments—from "playing house with my friends" to "learning about dinosaurs."
